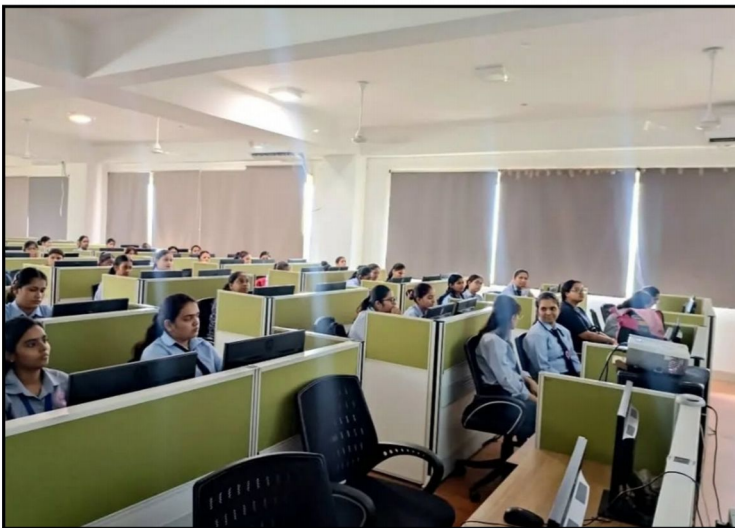

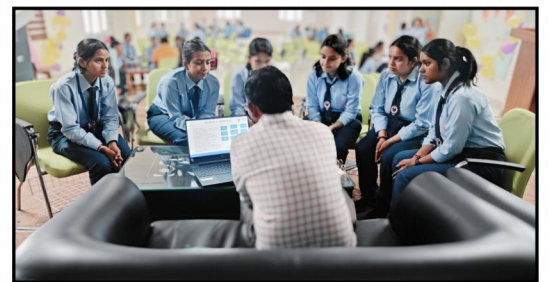
TEACHER'S DAY
